Tiffany: Motion to elect the chair of council.

Nick: Second.

Discussion:

Both candidates for upcoming chair were given a minute to speak to council about why they believe they should be the 2020-21 Chair of Council.

Tiffany: The chair nomination committee has met quite a few times. In the next few minutes, I will ask both the candidates for chair to give a quick talk on why they should be chair of council, then we will move to an in-camera session where we will discuss their interviews more in-depth. As they present, please refrain from questions until we move in-camera. We will discuss the candidates, and deliberate between the two.

Meredith (Gallery): I am in my second year, studying math. I am currently the Vice President at McKinnon Hall. Since starting at X, the Union has had a huge impact on me. The services pf the Union has helped me grow as a person, and for this reason I want to be a part of it. As a current sub0executive of the Union, I know the positive impact of positive individuals. As chair, I would hope to be someone people can come to for support and resources. I would also prioritize increasing the awareness of the Union on campus. I believe that this will increase involvement in the Union and increase election turnout. I am also very excited for the opportunity to participate in governance review. I have experience chairing my house council meetings. I have the skills to

Special Reports to Council

Presentation from Governance Review

Presentation given by William Fraser and Emma Kuzmyk.

Tiffany: Motion to go into camera for this presentation.

Todd: Second.

Discussion:

Will: I do not feel that what we will discuss is so secret that we need to go into camera.

Motion Fails 7-4-0.

Will F: We first discussed council structure in July and have since had pretty much one meeting a month discussing what council structure should look like. We've narrowed it down to two proposals, and now are presenting them to council.

Will B: The reason I didn't think this should be in camera, was because I think the students should be consulted on both proposals.

Since one proposal was written by Will F, and the other by Emma, they each present their proposal for council's discussion.

Will F: Mine proposes a council with a chair, deputy chair, and 8 representative councilors elected into staggered two-year terms. Four councilors would be elected each year. The following would exist for two years, with the option to have their existence extended by council: Queer student at large, African Descent student at large, International student at large, and Indigenous student at large. This proposal removes all executive members from council, following the advice of our governance specialist. Certain members will always be required to report to council, these being the President, the General Manager, all the executives, the Board of

Governors Representative, and the student senators. These members will be non-voting. There will be a committee to review reports and decide if these individuals will need to report to council. This committee will include the chair and some students at large. This proposal has a chair hired in April. According to our governance specialist, boards function best when there are no constituencies, and every voting member is elected by the entire student body.

Emma: My proposed council structure has 8 voting members, including a students of African descent representative, two Indigenous student representatives having one collective vote, an LGBTQ+ representative, an International student representative, an Accessibility student representative, and three open councilor representatives. The non-voting members would be the chair of council, deputy chair, general manager, president and vice president academic. Faculty representatives will be removed from council and only serve terms on senate. More special constituencies have been added to dismantle existing barriers for these students. Some boards that I sit on, which work really well, do have certain voices on them that are represented like this. The president and vice president are no longer members, but will still be required to attend and report to council. Hired executives will no longer attend council. There is no longer a faculty representative.

Questions:

Johanna: When would this be implemented?

Will F: After council passes it, hopefully during the 2021-22 academic year.

Cecil: Why are the president and vice president not voting?

Will B: We settles on this because we felt that the function of council is to oversee the president and giving them a vote in this body would present a conflict.

Ally: Would the elected councilors give reports at council?

Will F: No, councils only job is to oversee big picture things, not day-to-day. These were also made in hopes that we could increase the number of students-at-large within the Union. Once this process is done, the Union will look much different and there will be more students in these student-at-large positions.

Siobhan: If the governance advise was to have no special constituencies, why are there some included in the proposals?

Emma: I personally don't agree with that advice, as I believe that there are barriers in place for people who would fill these special constituencies and having them will make for a more accessible and representative council.

Will F: Mine has some temporary special constituencies because this was a direct suggestion from the governance advice. The idea that making these positions available specifically for these constituencies for a short amount of time will make them more accessible and common to exist without the constituencies being there in the future.

Tiffany: What would be the terms of review for these special constituencies? How will we know when we are ready to remove them? How do we make council so inclusive that we do not need these constituencies?

Kamy: This is a really good point, and it is important to consider that, in my opinion, our campus is very far from not needing these constituencies.

Emma: My proposal was made in attempts to have as much representation as possible on the board. I don't believe we should make decisions for groups of people without them making the decisions with them.

Natalie: In my opinion, our goal as an organization should be to be equitable. I don't think we are at a point as an organization to remove special constituencies and still be equitable. I think Will's proposal should be an ending point, but we are not ready for it yet.

Kamy: I agree that Wills could be the final point, and Emma's could be the next step. At STFX I would see taking away constituencies to be taking away diversity from council. To take away this representation is to take away voices.

Tiffany: I think Emma's proposal should be changed so that there is an odd number of voting members on council.

Will F: Thank you all for your opinions. The next step will be to bring this feedback back to our committee, where we will use it to create a proposal to present to students, then eventually bring a final proposal back to council to be voted on.

Tiffany: I am more interested in Emma's proposal with the addition of another voting member, and some mandatory review after a few years.

Kamy: I am also interested in Emma's proposal. I don't think our campus is ready to lose constituencies, and it would be kind of offensive.

Chair of Council

Tiffany: Motion to elect the chair of council.

Nick: Second.

Discussion:

Both candidates for the incoming chair of council position were given a minute to speak to council about why they believe they should be made the next chair.

Meredith (Gallery): I am in my second year studying math, I am the vice president of my house, and I work security at the Inn. I believe in the good that the Union does for students, so I would like to contribute to its success. I believe I have the skills needed to be chair. I chaired my house council this year and was the health and wellness representative before that. I recognize that house council is different from this council, but lots of my skills and experience will transfer over. I have effectively guided and motivated my council for the past year and have overseen 8 individuals and all the events in our house. I have strong leadership skills and work well with

others. My experience as vice president has required me to work on and be productive with a team. I have been able to effectively resolve conflict respectfully and professionally without jeopardizing the integrity of the team. As chair, I would always be available to the councilors and focus on supporting them in this role. I would like to increase awareness of the Union around campus, in order to increase voter turnout at elections. I care about the success of the Union, and would be excited to serve this council.

Will Fraser (Gallery): I think you know I can do this job. When I first decided to apply for chair, it was because I had already held man positions in the Union, and I realized what could happen when the Union doesn't function properly. I realized how much of a mess elections could be, and I realized that when procedures are not followed, the Union does not work. When this happens, students are not adequately represented, they do not get value for their dollar, and that's why I wanted to be chair in the first place. I know, based on the looks on some of your faces, that you don't think I've done a great job this year. What I can tell you, is that I am willing to improve. I have already sought out the additional training that was required for me. I always continue to try to do better. I am always working with governance specialists to improve in my role as chair. I think I have shown you why I am a good chair. We've increased voter turnout, we've seen the election system become more precise and accurate, and we see students being enfranchised in ways they have not been enfranchised before. We see people returning to council.

Tiffany: After this, we will go into camera to deliberate, narrow it down to one person, then come out of camera to amend the motion to a name, to follow Roberts Rules of Order.

Emma: Motion to enter an in-camera session for the remainder of this discussion.

Johanna: Second.

Motion Passes 11-0-0.

Council enters an in-camera session.

Debrief:

Will: We discussed the pros and cons about the candidates for chair. We also discussed the role of chair, and the ideal case that would be best for our organization.

Will: Motion to amend the past motion to elect Merideth Cudmore-Keating as the 2020-2021 Chair of Council.

- Everyone is getting ready to go online with classes.
- Moodle might be slow tomorrow because of all the courses moving online.
- There have been questions about students who may need financial help, we want to know about them so we can do everything we can to help.

Committee Reports

Governance Review Committee

• Have been meeting to consider feedback from council, most of which was in favor of keeping constituencies.

- Reached conclusion on the proposed structure of council, which was to have half general councilors, half constituencies which will be determined on a rotating basis.
- Have been making progress in drafting bylaws and have sent those into our lawyer for review.

Organizational Review Committee

• Decided to go ahead and release survey, even though it will be delayed due to students being relocated and moving to online school.

External Affairs Advisory Committee

• Unable to do open forum like we had hoped.

Award Planning Committee

- Banquet will be cancelled, but we are still giving out awards.
- These announcements will come out later this week.

Student Union Awards Committee

- Chose winners for all awards.
- Announcements will come out in the future.

Special Reports to Council

Draft Budget Presentation

Presentation given by Patrick Wallace- VP Finance and Operations

• Council was shown the process of the budget, and questions were welcomed.

It was expressed that it would probably be in councils best interest to wait to approve the budget until it can be looked at in another meeting, as it was not yet completely ready for review.

Peer Support Project Renewal Presentation

Presentation given by Addy Strickland and Riley Wolfe.

Questions:

Q: For the office supply fee, is that reoccurring every month?

A: This is a \$100 fee for the whole year.

Q: \$100 sounds a bit low, especially for printing and distributing information. It should be more.

A: If we can, we could do that, but this cost was based on the amount we spent this year.

Q: Does the student union not have money pre-existing for printing for services? If you can access this, what else would the money be for?

A: We would use it for general supplies, pens, pencils, tea.

Q: Why does the PSP need 2 coordinators? Most other services only have one.

A: We had 2 so they could bear the work of starting the new program, and as one of our coordinators is graduating, it will make the transition period of running the program much easier.

Q: Would cutting down to one coordinator be an option in the future? Will 2 coordinators be an absolute necessity?

A: Figuring out the future is something we would discuss with the union, but for now, as the project is so new, yes, it is essential, especially for sustainability purposes. It is also important so the coordinators can keep their own mental health in check.

Q: What is the justification of one program coordinator appointing the next, opposed to them being hired by councilors and the union, like the other services of the union do.

A: This is open to change in the future, but for now experience is the most important.

Q: It seems like the program had a lot of value, especially with the volunteer training. Is there any way to get the volunteer training to more students on campus?

A: This is definitely something that is possible, as lots of the training is offered throughout the year.

Q: Would you be willing to follow the hiring policy that the operations of the Union follow?

A: Yes.

Q: What goals have you met this year?

A: To help students, and to have a positive impact on campus. The general goal was a visit every few days, which we definitely met. We are proud of what we did, and hope to have more visits next year with a better advertising strategy. People have been using the office for many more reasons than we anticipated.

Q: Do you have feedback from people who did use the service?

A: Got some emotional messages stating that a student felt it was the only safe place on campus for them. Many people are very happy the service exists.

Q: Do you see an opportunity or recommend to have another pilot term to gain more data, since your term was cut short.

A: We do think we are ready to become a permanent service, but would be open to another pilot year if council deems it necessary.

New Business

Emma: Motion to create the Peer Support Program.

Sanjidha: Second

Discussion:

Will: In my judgement, this is walking the knifes edge of worthwhile. In my opinion, the demand for it was low, and the expected criteria of success was pretty low. It's hard to judge how much success there was. Also, I do not think the proposed terms of reference for them are unreasonable. The pay for the program coordinators was too high, and they do not seem to follow many of the rules of services of the Union.

Emma: I think a lot of students did reach out to me saying they used the service and that it was useful to them. I agree that the terms of reference should be changed, and they did mention that they are willing to do this. It is also notable to remember that they have applied to grants, which would help on the monetary side.

Patrick: Remember that the amount of money the PSP is asking for is pretty insignificant, in my opinion, in comparison to what the program is about. My office takes some of the blame for the hiring situation, which can easily be fixed.

Cecil: It is hard to base a decision on the limited information we have, as we didn't make it through the whole pilot program. I would propose to extend the pilot program, so we can have more tangible data and make a more informed decision.

Jasonique: I feel as if the program isn't necessary, it seems like it could be a website. The funding could be better focused on some existing resources.

Daniel: I agree with Cecil's proposal regarding the lack of data making it too difficult to make an informed decision. We could come up with more detailed ways to document measures of success.

Sean: I can understand the direction of extending the pilot program, but it is important to remember we would still be responsible to fund it.

Siobhan: It seems to be a very separate operation from the Union, and I would like to see more collaboration between the program and the Union. I like the idea of extending the pilot program.

Tiffany: I do not like the idea of extending the pilot program for 4 months. We're going to be paying the price for a full year, so it would be a waste of student dollars. Just looking at the low usage of the program, I do not think it is necessary to have.

Natalie: Even though the numbers do not look great, but to me success is just helping one person alone. I think we should re-evaluate some numbers and then try again next year, while continuously evaluating its success.

Emma: I agree that a 4-month pilot extension would not be a good use of time, and if we are looking to do another pilot it should be a whole year, start to end. I think the point of the program was the ability to have in-person discussions, which you can't get from a website. As an organization, I feel as if we haven't done enough to help them integrate into the Union. I do believe that the program was used quite a bit, even though the amount who filled out official documentation was low.

Nick: I feel like we should table this motion for now. I do not think the program should be cancelled completely, at least without any further discussion.

Emma: I am in favor of creating the program, as long as we fix the terms of reference. These could include that the program should be evaluated on a yearly basis.

Motion Passes 7-5-0.

Cecil: Motion to suspend all office hours for the remainder of the academic year.

Johanna: Second.

Discussion:

Cecil: Given the current circumstances, and the current government declared state of emergency, this is only fair. We will still be working, just not in the office.

Motion Passes 12-0-0.

Todd: Motion to suspend the requirement to hold a Special Council Meeting at least 72 hours after receipt of a request for the remainder of the academic year.

Cecil: Second.

Discussion:

Todd: Due to the current situation, this makes sense in case there is something urgent council needs to decide.

Motion Passes 12-0-0.

Cecil: Motion to reallocate \$6000 from the Society Allocations budget line to the Emergency Grants fund.

Daniel: Second

Discussion:

Patrick: Societies have pretty much stopped operating, and we haven't given out all the money we could have. This money would help cover the emergent applications coming in from the COVID-19 situation.

Todd: Has there been an increase of requests due to COVID-19?

Patrick: There hasn't been, too many, since we have run out of funds, but we are expecting more to come in as people have shown interest.

Sean: There has been a few international students looking for information on the emergency grants. If we do pass this motion, we should make it well knows to students that this money is available.

Motion Passes 12-0-0.

Closing Remarks

Committees:

Finance Committee: On March 19th and 31st, the University's budget committee met to discuss the repayment of residence and meal hall fees, and other issues that the Covid 19 pandemic has caused the University. After discussing options, the Finance Committee has made a recommendation to the Executive Committee of the Board for their approval.

Executive Committee: Due to the recent events of Covid 19, the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors met on March 20th and 30th to discuss the University's plans to adapt, and approved the refund of residence fees and meal hall fees.

Covid 19 Steering Committee: Beginning on March 12th, the Covid 19 steering committee has met 3 times weekly. This committee was created to help advise the University administration on how each department on campus are adapting to the crisis. Through this committee Emma Kuzmyk and I have brought up concerns of academics, residence and meal along with all other issues students are facing due to Covid 19. The work of this committee has been fast, and effective but much more work is to be done!

CASA Governance and Internal Review Committee: In preparation for the last plenary of the year, the GIRC committee met on March 17, to further our conversations about comments and changes on the Operations and Procedures manual. These changes were brought to the board for their acceptance and implementation. Students NS Governance Committee: On March 17th, the Students' NS governance committee met to finalize our progress on our delegated policies for the Board meeting in late March. The committee also met to review the Executive Directors review process and adapt it according to the most recent needs on the Board.



Internal:

Nimbus Peer Tutoring App: Over the month of March, the Student Success Centre, Nimbus and I have been meeting regularly to discuss how to adapt the delivery of Nimbus Peer Tutoring because of the effects of Covid 19. I had the opportunity to meet different delegates in the Schwartz Business school, and understand the issues they face on campus, but also attend informative lessons on how to create an increasingly positive environment in the workplace that Women can thrive in.

Covid 19: Since March 12th, the Students' Union executives and I have been hard at work meeting 3 times a week to adapt to the quickly changing developments of Covid 19. With the goal of keeping our students safe on campus and off, we have adapted our business model to keep the Student Food Resource Centre open but all other business facets closed. Where possible, we have asked the executives and full time staff to respect the province's requirement of social distancing and work from home. Committees

Governance Review Committee: The Governance Review Committee has been meeting every Wednesday of the month, and has been focussed on the draft of the Bylaws, and the new council and executive structures.

Senate: The University Senate met on March 2nd. During this meeting there were reports from multiple Senate committees, and motions from the Dean of Arts and the Dean of Science.

External Affairs

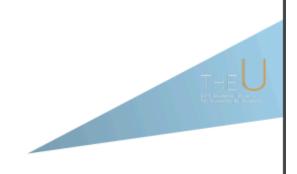
I have been participating in video calls related to the national Courage to Act project, and discussing with people across the province best practices when it comes to transferring in-person services to ones that can be done virtually.
